The City Council of the City of Lubbock, Texas met in emergency session on the 18th day of August, 2007, in the City Council Chambers, first floor, City Hall, 1625 13th Street, Lubbock, Texas at 5:00 P. M.

Mayor Miller convened the meeting at 5:00 P. M.**

1. REGULAR AGENDA

- 1.1. Resolution No. 2007-R0373 accepting the request of the Governor to take refugees of Hurricane Dean and to incur expenditures of up to \$500,000 (to be taken from General Funds and reimbursed by FEMA) for shelter, clothing, food and other emergency items.**

Motion was made by Council Member Price, seconded by Council Member Jones to pass Resolution No. 2007-R0373 as recommended by staff.

City Manager Lee Ann Dumbauld stated that, "Governor Perry and the State Operations Center are preparing for Hurricane Dean. President Bush, this afternoon, approved a disaster declaration for the state of Texas, as requested by the Governor. It is anticipated that, even if Hurricane Dean enters Mexico, the southern portions of the Texas coast will have significant weather impacts. As requested by the State Operations Center, the City began today preparing to receive evacuees from south Texas. This emergency City Council meeting is required so that the City can be reimbursed by the State for all costs associated with this operation. If the City received evacuees from the valley, we expect to receive them by air. Initial preparations provide for sheltering 800 folks, 400 at the Coliseum and 400 at the Civic Center. As the weather models are able to define more accurately where Dean will make landfall, our plans will be refined for sheltering requirements."

Motion carried: 5 Ayes, 0 Nays.
