CITY OF LUBBOCK
REGULATIONS GOVERNING ATHLETICS

ALL SPORTS...

I. Supervision and Administration

- A. The head of all leagues shall be the Assistant Recreation Coordinator or his/her appointed agents. In all matters not covered in these rules and regulations the Assistant Recreation Coordinator or his agents shall have jurisdiction.
- B. Managers, players, and spectators shall at all times be under the jurisdiction of the Assistant Recreation Coordinator or his/her agents in all matters pertaining to the rules, eligibility, conduct, and scheduling.
- C. Game Officials have full jurisdiction over ALL participants and spectators present at a City of Lubbock sponsored athletic contest. They shall have the power to take whatever steps necessary in order to maintain peace, order, and control of a situation as they see fit.
- D. All Game Officials shall be under the direct supervision of the contracted association.
- E. Managers are responsible for knowledge of all rules and regulations pertaining to a sport. Teams entering League or Tournament competition agree to abide by guidelines adopted by the Outdoor Recreation Department or the appropriate sanctioning body.
- F. To confirm a same day game cancellation contact the Athletic Information Line at (806)775-3663.

II. Conduct

- A. Managers are responsible for the conduct of their Players, Coaches, and Spectators prior to, during, and after an athletic contest.
- B. Profanity, vulgarity, unsportsmanlike conduct, or unsafe acts of any nature will not be tolerated for any reason.
- C. Consumption of alcoholic beverages by participants or spectators is prohibited. Violators may be removed from the area and may be suspended indefinitely from returning and/or participating in further competition. (Code of Ordinances, Number 7662).

- D. Any participant who physically attacks or verbally threatens a Game Official or City of Lubbock representative may be charged with assault and battery and be suspended indefinitely from all City of Lubbock athletic and recreational sponsored activities.

III. Protest

- A. Any protest to be considered must be made to the Senior Game Official at the time of the play in question and noted by the Official Scorekeeper that the game is being played “Under Protest.” A formal written protest should be submitted to the appropriate Assistant Recreation Coordinator within forty-eight (48) hours, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and City Holidays after the occurrence. **Any protest submitted after the forty-eight (48) hours will not be considered a valid protest.**
- B. Protests regarding misinterpretation of rules by Game Officials will be settled in accordance with the rules and regulations adopted by the Outdoor Recreation Department.
- C. Protests regarding Judgment calls made by a Game Official will be neither accepted nor considered.
- D. Protest of a player’s eligibility will not be allowed. Player eligibility is an administrative matter and will not be considered a formal protest. Rosters are checked on a daily basis for players participating in rostered leagues.

*****Playing an Ineligible or Illegal Player(s) will result in a Forfeit.
This may also be retroactive*****

IV. Suspensions

- A. Any participants ejected from a league or tournament game competition by a Game Official shall be considered ineligible for further competition with any Team, in any sport, until reinstated by the appropriate Assistant Recreation Coordinator/Tournament Director.
- B. The Assistant Recreation Coordinator may impose player and/or team suspensions based upon the severity of any infraction before, during, or after an athletic event. Severe infractions or incidents may be referred to the Outdoor Recreation Supervisor.
- C. Any participant ejected from a league or tournament game competition by a Game Official or League Administrator will be suspended for a minimum of one (1) week and placed on a one year probation. Any participant ejected from a league or tournament game while serving their one year probation will automatically be suspended for a minimum of one year.

- D. Any player's or participant's suspension will encompass **ALL SPORTS** for the duration for the suspension period. Suspended players and participants will not be eligible for participation in any City League sport or tournament competition. A suspension period shall be deemed as one (1) week in any City League scheduled competition. This shall not include rained-out, postponed, or cancelled City League games. If in the following week, during the player's or participant's suspension period, his/her team or event is rained-out, postponed, or cancelled the suspension shall be carried forward into the following week.
- E. Any player or participant suspended for a specific number of City League weeks will have said suspension carried over into the next session or season if the suspension warrants. Example: A Player suspended for two (2) City League weeks and there is only one (1) City League week remaining on their team's league schedule for the first session of competition. Suspension shall include the remaining City League game of first session, plus first City League game scheduled for second session or season.

V. Procedure For Suspending Participants:

- A. In the event of In the event of a player(s) or participant(s) receiving a possible or probable suspension period from City League competition, the following procedures will be followed:
 - 1. The Assistant Recreation Coordinator shall collect and compile all pertinent data regarding a possible or probable suspension of a player(s) or participant(s).
 - 2. The Assistant Recreation Coordinator will conduct a thorough investigation and review regarding the incident including all involved parties. This shall include players, managers, game officials, scorekeepers, and if possible unbiased spectators.
 - 3. All participants being reviewed for a possible suspension, including the manager of the team, shall be suspended from all City League competition until the investigation/review is completed and a decision has been made by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator as to the disciplinary action to be taken.
 - 4. The Assistant Recreation Coordinator shall then make a decision as to disciplinary action regarding the specific incident and the participant(s). This shall include any incident which shall be deemed a Minor infraction. Minor infractions shall be incidents regarding the Eligibility of Players, which may constitute a suspension period ranging from one (1) week minimum to five (5) weeks maximum in any City League competition.

5. All Major infractions will be investigated and reviewed by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator and may be referred to the Outdoor Recreation Supervisor for a ruling. Major infractions shall be incidents regarding unsportsmanlike conduct, any prolonged physical confrontation involving a participant(s) and any game official, and any verbal or physical incidents involving a group of participants creating a near riot situation.
6. All rulings made by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator or the Outdoor Recreation Supervisor concerning any disciplinary action levied are binding and final.

VI. Appeals

- A. Suspensions imposed by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator regarding Minor infraction may be appealed in writing to the Assistant Recreation Coordinator within seventy-two (72) hours after the disciplinary action is levied by the Outdoor Recreation Supervisor. The appeal will then be referred to the Athletic Supervisor for review. The participant will remain ineligible during the appeal.
- B. Decisions on appeals handed down by the Outdoor Recreation Supervisor may be appealed in writing to the Supervisor within seventy-two (72) hours after the disciplinary action is levied by the Outdoor Recreation Department. The appeal will then be referred to the Park Board Committee for review.
- C. All rulings by the Park Board Committee concerning disciplinary action regarding Minor infractions are binding and final.

VII. Fees and Payments

- A. All fees shall be due at the time of registration. Payments may be made by personal check, cashier's check, money order, master card, and visa. Proper identification is required upon request. Driver's license number is required on all checks.
- B. A **\$30 charge** will be added to entry fees for teams registering after the early deadline.
- C. Refunds shall not be granted except in special circumstances and each case shall be judged independently according to merit.

- D. Teams or individuals passing bad checks shall lose their registration privilege. If scheduling is completed for City League or Tournament competition, the bad check shall be turned over to a Collection Agency and a **\$25.00** charge will be added to each returned check. In the event the Collection Agency is unable to collect, the check will then be forwarded to the District Attorney's Office for collection. All participants associated with this infraction will be suspended until debt is collected.
- E. In the case of a forfeit, the teams may use the field or gym for the remainder of the regularly scheduled game time. The following game shall have preference and shall start as scheduled.

VIII. Identification

- A. Participants in all sports should, upon request of a Game Official or City representative, be prepared to present proper identification (Texas Driver's License, Military or Photo ID) at game site. Failure to do so could result in a suspension and game forfeiture determined by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator.
- B. The Manager of a team may request an identification check of an opposing team's player(s) through a Game Official. If ID is not produced, the player in question will not be allowed to participate.

IX. Changing Teams

- A. Players may switch teams in a Rostered League provided they receive written permission from the Manager of the team from which they are transferring.
- B. The Assistant Recreation Coordinator must receive written notification of a released player from the coach or manager and said player must be added to the roster of his/her new team by the coach or manager prior to his/her participation with this new team.
- C. After notification by the coach or manager players from a disbanded team shall be considered released players.

X. League Awards

- A. Awards will be presented to each League Champion and Runner-Up in both Rostered and Non-rostered League competitions.
 - 1. League champion(s) and runner-up(s) will receive team awards. League champions will receive individual Champion awards for softball, baseball, kick ball and flag football. Each team will be allotted 15 individual Champion awards. For volleyball and basketball, each team will receive 12 individual champion awards.

2. All awards will be held for a maximum of one (1) month after a team Manager or player has been contacted. All rights to awards will be forfeited a after the one (1) month period.
 3. Awards in baseball and football will be awarded to the tournament winners in lieu of league awards.
- B. The Team with the best win-loss record shall be declared the Champion. In the event two or more teams are tied for an award place, the following formats will be used to determine the League Champion and Runner-up:
1. The team having the best record in direct competition (games and matches) with all other tied teams shall be declared the League Champion and/or Runner Up.
 2. In the event teams are still tied, the team having the fewest number of forfeits shall be declared League Champion and/or Runner-Up.
 3. In the event that teams are still tied, the total number of points or runs given up in direct competition with all other tied teams shall determine the League Champion and/or Runner-Up.
 4. In the event the teams are still tied, a one (1) game Play-Off will be played to determine the League Champion and/or Runner-Up.
- C. Any Team registered in any City League sport that forfeits three (3) City League games or matches may be suspended from any further City League competition for the remainder of the session/season and may forfeit all rights to any awards gained while in league play.
- D. All games played will count in league standings.

XI. Injuries

- A. Participation in any City of Lubbock Outdoor Recreation Department athletic event is entirely voluntary. The City of Lubbock, City Representative, or Game Official assumes no responsibility for injuries received by any participant while involved in a City of Lubbock Athletic event.
- B. Team insurance is available through a number of local and national athletic insurance companies and agencies. Information is available through the Outdoor Recreation Department

XII. Use of City Operated Facilities

- A. The Outdoor Recreation Department Athletic Division reserves the right to reschedule or preempt any and all City League games in order to prepare and maintain facilities for special scheduled activities or to complete a season session.



SOFTBALL

I. League Types

A. Rostered Leagues

1. Rosters are required and maintained in the Outdoor Recreation Office. Team may add/drop eligible players up until the deadline date set by the Outdoor Recreation Office, however, each team must maintain a weekly roster in our office no later than 5pm game day until the deadline.
*****Rosters shall not exceed 20 players*****
2. Participants in this league must appear on a team's roster to be eligible. Rosters will be checked daily and forfeits will be issued if any illegal or ineligible player(s) appear.
3. Eligibility of Participants will be handled by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator any time that a violation is discovered. Individuals are allowed to participate with only one Mixed Team and also one Rostered Men's League or Rostered Women's League Team.
4. Types of Rostered Leagues Available are: Men's, Women's, and Mixed (Men and Women).
5. Individuals may participate with only one Rostered League team each night. For example an individual may participate with only one Rostered Men's team, Women's team, and Mixed team each night, including specialty programs.
6. Women's Program – Two divisions will now be in place with the intentions of allowing maximum participation and will be configured so the divisions are well defined. Divisions will be set forth according to the following parameters, not based on tournament team classifications.
 - a. Recreation Division will use the following guidelines:
 1. This division will be a closed roster league.
 2. No female player currently on a women's tournament team roster will be allowed to participate in this division. (Exception female players over 40 years of age).
 3. Penalty for not abiding by the above guideline will result in a forfeit of any game in which a female tournament player participated in and can be retroactive to discovery of such player's participation.
 - b. Competitive Division will use the following guidelines:
 1. This division will be an open roster league.

2. All female tournament team players are eligible to participate in this league regardless of tournament team classification.
3. Players that currently participate in the recreation division are also eligible to participate in this division if they choose to.

B. Open Roster Leagues (Competitive): These are leagues with the 1-up homerun rule and higher.

C. Eligibility of participants will be handled by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator any time that a violation is discovered. Individuals are allowed to participate with only one Mixed team and also one Rostered League Men's or Women's Team. Types of leagues offered are: Men's, Women's, Church and Mixed (Men & Women).

D. Home Run Rules/Classifications:

A limit of over-the-fence home runs will be used in all men's and mixed slow pitch divisions. All balls hit over the fence in a game by a team in excess of the limitations will be ruled on as shown:

II. Eligibility of Players

A. All players must be eligible under the rules set forth by the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation, Outdoor Recreation Department, and the appropriate National Governing Body regulating that league, which is United States Specialty Sports Association, (USSSA).

B. All players must be the minimum age of eighteen (18) years old before they are eligible to participate in any league.

III. Regulations Governing the Conduct of Games

A. Rules governing all play will be those adopted by the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation, Outdoor Recreation Department, and the appropriate National Governing Body regulating that league, which is United States Specialty Sports Association, (USSSA).

- B. Each Team's manager must present a written Line-Up containing the first and last names of his/her Starting Players according to the batting order. **Line-ups must be turned into the Official Scorekeeper five (5) minutes prior to Team's office Game Time.** Line-Ups turned in at this time must contain a minimum of eight (8) names to officially and legally start a game. If a team does not turn in a line-up on time, the game will be played under protest providing each team has at least eight (8) legal players. The Athletic Division will then rule on the protest the following day, and the team may be subject to a forfeiture of the game for not complying with the line-up regulations.
- C. Official game Line-Ups may be changed or altered up until the official game time is declared. Official game time will be determined by the game time listed on the League Schedule or by the Home Plate Umpire. (See "L") Any changes of Line-Ups after the official game time has been declared will be considered substitutions.
- D. Participants in all sports should, upon request of a Game Official or City representative, be prepared to present proper identification (Texas Driver's License, Military or Photo ID) at game site. **Failure to do so could result in a suspension and game forfeiture determined by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator.**
- E. The Manager of a team may request an identification check of an opposing team's player(s) through a Game Official.
- F. Game officials have full jurisdiction over all participants and spectators present at a City sponsored athletic contest. They shall have the power to take whatever steps necessary in order to maintain peace, order, and control of a situation as they see fit.
- G. Any participant who physically attacks or verbally threatens a Game Official or City of Lubbock representative may be charged with assault and battery and be suspended indefinitely from all City of Lubbock athletic and recreational sponsored activities.
- H. Substitutes need not be listed on the game Line-Up submitted to the Official Score keeper, but must report to the Home Plate Umpire immediately upon entry into the game, both offensively and defensively.
- I. Players entering a game after the official game time has been declared, other than a substitute to fill out a complete Line-Up, must be placed at the end of the batting order.

- J. Prior to game time, team representatives should meet with the umpires for the purpose of correcting official Line-Ups, exchanging correct Line-Ups, and discussing ground rules.
- K. Teams, may begin with or continue with a minimum of eight (8) players. No team may play with less than eight (8) legal participants. Mixed teams may start with twelve (12), ten (10), nine (9) or eight (8) players. If starting with nine (9) players there must be five (5) females in the lineup and a female must be in the first position in the batting order.
***Shorthanded Rule:** Any team starting with nine (9) or more players may drop down to the minimum eight (8) players for any reason. Teams may continue playing if a player is ejected, without substitution, if they do not drop below eight.
- L. Teams wishing to use the Extra Player (EP) in slow pitch, must turn in a full Line-Up of twelve (12) players for Men's, Women's and Mixed Teams to the Official Scorekeeper five (5) minutes prior to the regularly scheduled game time. The EP(s) must be shown on the official line-up and official score sheet as one of the team's twelve (12) batters. The symbol EP must appear.

1. **Specific Clarification of Extra Player(s):**

- a. Men's & Women's Slow pitch leagues: The EP must remain in the same position in the batting order for the entire game. If an EP is used, all twelve (12) players must bat and any ten (10) players can play defense. Defensive positions can be changed, but the batting order must remain the same. The EP may be substituted for at any time, either by a pinch-runner or pinch-hitter, who then becomes the EP. The substitute must be a player that has not been in the game. The starting EP can re-enter.
- b. Mixed Slow pitch Leagues: The EP (s) must remain in the same batting order for the entire game. All twelve (12) players must bat and any ten (10) players can play defense. Substitutes for the EP (s) cannot have previously played in the game and the starting EP (s) can re-enter.
- M. Mixed batting orders must be alternated according to Player's sex. If a male batter is walked, the offensive manager shall have the option of having the next batter awarded first base or bat in normal sequence. The male is awarded second base.

- N. In Mixed Leagues, should a player leave a game due to ejection or injury and no legal substitute is available, the player batting immediately before or after the ejected/injured player must also leave the game (Manager's discretion) and adhere to the eight (8) player limit. This player then becomes a legal substitute and may re-enter the game without penalty. Automatic outs will not be assessed to a team dropping to an eight (8) player limit.
- O. Official Time will be kept by the Official Scorekeeper and will be the same as given at 795-3434.
- P. All starting players may re-enter the game once in any defensive position, but must resume the same place in the batting order.
1. Violation of the Re-Entry Rule: Ejection of ineligible player and offending teams manager when protested to the Home Plate Umpire by the offended team.
- Q. The Official Scorekeeper will permit a fifty-five (55) minute Playing Time for slow pitch games from the time of the coin flip. When an inning begins the inning must be completed unless the Home Team is batting and leading in number of runs scored.
- R. The run rule applied to all City league games is 15 runs after 2 1/2 or 3 innings or 10 runs after 4 1/2 or 5 innings.
- S. **Flip/Flop Rule: In the inning when the run rule is exceeded and the home team is losing, the home team will remain at bat and become the visiting team. If the team (new visiting team) does not score enough runs to reduce the run difference below the run rule, the game is over. If they reduce the run difference to below the run rule then the new home team will bat. If they subsequently score enough runs to exceed the run rule, the game will be over; if they do not, the game will continue under that format. If the situation reverses, the teams would flip/flop again.**
- T. In the event of inclement weather, the Home Plate Umpire shall have the power to suspend the game. **Two and one-half (2 1/2) innings or Thirty-five minutes (35)** shall constitute an official game, provided the Home Team is leading in runs. Games not reaching this point will be replayed completely at a later date.

- U. In the event of light failure or a serious injury, a suspended game will be rescheduled at a later date and resumed at the point of interruption, or replayed completely as so directed by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator.
- V. Make-up games will be rescheduled and team informed of the time, date, and field.
- W. A batter will be allowed three (3) balls or two (2) strikes for each at bat.

*****NOTE – If profanity continues an ejection will be assessed*****

- X. Verbal outbursts of casual profanity of any nature, whether directed toward a person or object, is strictly prohibited.

PENALTY:

1. On any violation an out will be issued:
 2. Offense violation an out will be automatically issued.
 3. Defense violation an out will be issued to first batter in that inning.
- Y. A ball hitting the wire located over the outfield of Mackenzie #7 will be ruled as follows:
 1. A ball hitting the wire and then landing out of play will be ruled a ground rule double.
 2. A ball hitting the wire and then landing in the field of play will be ruled a ground rule single.

IV. Equipment

- A. Game officials shall not allow the use of any equipment which in their opinion is unsafe to a Participant. All softball equipment must comply with the current USSSA and TAAF rules and regulations as warranted.
- B. No metal or polyurethane spikes similar to metal sole and heel plate or shoes with detachable (female) cleats are allowed in any slow pitch at any level of competition. The soles may be either smooth or have rubber cleats.
- C. Individuals may not play in their stockings or bare feet. They must wear a type of shoe.
- D. Teams are required to furnish their own equipment.

- E. Teams will use their own ball. Each team is responsible for providing a ball to the opposing pitcher. It shall be the pitcher's responsibility to be sure this is a legal ball. If a question or protest arises, the Home Plate Umpire will rule before the ball is thrown.

- F. Jewelry is not permitted on playing field if deemed unsafe by the umpire. Any player refusing to remove jewelry will not be allowed to participate. Exception: Medical Alert jewelry is allowed, but it must be taped down.

KICKBALL

I. League Types

A. Rostered Leagues:

1. Rosters are required and maintained in the Outdoor Recreation Office. Teams may add/drop eligible players up until the deadline date set by the Outdoor Recreation Office, however, each team must maintain a weekly roster in our office no later than 5pm on game day until the deadline.
Rosters shall not exceed 20 players
2. Participants in this league must appear on a team's roster to be eligible. Rosters will be checked daily and forfeits will be issued if any illegal or ineligible player(s) appear.
3. Eligibility of participants will be handled by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator any time that a violation is discovered.
4. **Types of Rostered Leagues available are: Mixed and Women's.**
5. Individuals may participate with only one Rostered League team each night. For example, an individual may participate with only one Rostered Men's or Women's team, and one Mixed team each night.

II. Eligibility of Players:

- A. All Players must be eligible under the rules set forth by the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation (TAAF), United States Specialty Sports Association (USSSA), and those adopted by the Outdoor Recreation Department.
- B. All players must be the minimum age of eighteen (18) years old before they are eligible to participate in any league.

III. Regulations Governing the Conduct of Games:

- A. All players must be eligible under the rules set for the by the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation (TAAF), United States Specialty Sports Association (USSSA), and those adopted by the Outdoor Recreation Department.

- B. Each team's manager must present a written line-up containing first and last names of his/her starting players according to kicking order. Line-ups must be submitted to Official score keeper five (5) minutes prior to the teams SCHEDULED GAME TIME. Line-ups submitted must have a minimum of eight (8) names to officially and legally start a game. If a team does not turn in a line-up on time, the game will be played under protest; providing each team has at least eight (8) legal players. The Assistant Recreation Coordinator will then rule on the protest the following day and the team may be subject to forfeiture of the game for not complying with the line-up regulations.
- C. Official game line-ups may be changed or altered up until official game time has been declared. Official game time will be determined by the game time listed on the League Schedule or by the Home Plate Umpire. Any changes to the line-ups after the declared game will be considered substitutions.
- D. Participants in all sports should upon request of a Game Official or City Representative be prepared to present proper identification (Driver's License, Military or Photo ID). Failure to produce a photo ID will make you ineligible to participate for the remainder of that game and could result in a suspension and game forfeiture determined by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator.
- E. The manager of a team may request an identification check of an opposing teams player(s) through the Game Official.
- F. Game Officials have full jurisdiction over all participants and spectators present at a City of Lubbock sponsored athletic contest. They shall have the power to take the steps necessary in order to maintain peace, order and control of a situation.
- G. Any participant who physically or verbally threatens a Game Official or a City of Lubbock representative, may be charged with assault and battery and be suspended indefinitely from all City of Lubbock athletic or recreational sponsored activities.
- H. Substitutes need not be on the game Line-Up submitted to the Official Score Keeper, but must report to the Home Plate Umpire immediately upon entry into the game, both offensively and defensively.
- I. Players entering the game after official game time has been declared, other than a substitute to fill out a complete line-up, must be placed at the end of the batting order.

J. Prior to game time, a team representative should meet with the umpires for the purpose of correcting the official line-up, exchanging line-ups, discussing ground rules and flipping a coin to determine Home Team.

K. Teams may begin with or continue with eight (8) players. No team may play with less than eight (8) legal participants. Mixed teams may start with twelve (12), or ten (10) players.

***Shorthanded Rule for League Play:** Any team starting with a legal amount of players may drop down to eight (8) players for any reason for League Play. Teams may continue playing if a player is ejected without a substitution as long as they do not fall below eight (8) players.

L. Teams wishing to use the Additional Kicker (AK) in Kick Ball must turn in a full Line-Up of eleven (11) players for Men's and Women's or twelve (12) for Mixed teams to the Official Score Keeper five (5) minutes prior to the regularly scheduled game time. The AK must be shown on the official Line-Up and official score sheet as one of the team's eleven (11) or twelve (12) Kickers. The symbol AK must appear.

M. To make an out on defense you have the following options:

1. Throw the ball to the base ahead of the runner to force them out.
2. Tag the runner from the shoulders down with the ball.
3. Throw the ball at the runner and make contact from the waist down. In the event that the ball goes too far from the runner the umpire shall call time and stop play putting the runners back to the appropriate base at the time of the out.

N. The kicker may not bunt kick. They must take a full kick at the ball.

O. **No player shall play in front of the pitcher. If the umpire sees the player in front of the pitcher before the pitch it will be ruled a dead ball 'Ball'.**

P. Mixed Kicking orders must alternate according to the Player's sex. If a male kicker is walked, the offensive manager shall have the option with two (2) outs of having the next kicker awarded first or to kick in normal sequence. The male is awarded second base.

Q. Any pitch in the judgment of the umpire with excessive speed shall be declared a ball for the kicker and a verbal warning issued to the pitcher. Any subsequent excessive speed pitches and the umpire shall remove the pitcher from that position for the remainder of the game. The pitcher can remain in the game at a different position.

- R. If an outfielder kicks the ball back into the infield and the ball goes into dead Ball territory (i.e. over the fence, etc.), the base runners will be awarded two Bases from the time the kick and from the last point of the base runners. (i.e. if the base runner is between 1st and 2nd base at the time of the kicked ball the runner will be awarded 3rd base).
- S. In Mixed Leagues, should a player have to leave a game due to injury or ejection and no legal substitute is available, the player Kicking immediately before or after the ejected or injured player must also leave the game (Manager's discretion) and adhere to the eight (8) player limit.
- T. Official Time will be kept by the Official Score Keeper and will be the same time as given at 795-3434.
- U. The Official Score Keeper will permit fifty (50) minutes Playing Time for Kick Ball from the time of the first pitch. When an inning begins, the inning must be completed unless the Home Team is kicking and leading in the number of runs scored.
- V. The run ruled applied for City of Lubbock Kick Ball league games is 20 runs after 3 and a half or 4 innings or 15 runs ahead after 45 minutes when the current inning is completed.
- W. Courtesy Runner may only be used in the event of an injury. If the injured person cannot continue play, then a courtesy runner may be used at that point and it has to be the same gender of the injured person and must be the person who made the last out previous to the injury. Once the courtesy runner is used for an injury, the injured person may not reenter for the remainder of the game.
- X. In the event of inclement weather, the Umpire shall have the power to suspend the game. Four and one half (4 1/2) innings or thirty (30) minutes shall constitute an official game, provided the home team is leading in runs. Games not reaching this point will be replayed in its entirety at a later date.
- Y. In the event of light failure or a serious injury, a suspended game will be rescheduled at a later date and resumed at the point of interruption or replayed in its entirety as so directed by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator.
- Z. Make-up games will be rescheduled and team will be informed of the time, date and field.

IV. Equipment

- A. Kick Balls will be provided by the City of Lubbock and will be the only Official Game Balls allowed for use.

- B. No metal or polyurethane spikes similar to a metal sole and heel plate or shoes with detachable (female) cleats are allowed in any level of competition. The soles must be smooth or have rubber cleats.

- C. Jewelry is not permitted on the playing field if deemed unsafe by the umpire. Any player refusing to remove jewelry will not be permitted to participate. Exception: Medical Alert jewelry is allowed, but must be taped down. Smooth wedding bands may also be worn.

VOLLEYBALL

I. League Types

A. Rostered Leagues:

1. All teams are required to maintain a roster in the City Outdoor Recreation office. Teams may add-drop eligible players until the deadline date set by Outdoor Recreation. **Roster shall not exceed twelve (12).**
2. Types of leagues offered are: Men's, Women's, and Mixed.
3. All matches will be officiated by officials appointed by the City's Outdoor Recreation Department.

B. Teams playing in either the Fall or Winter season/session(s) will be able to qualify for State Competition.

II. Eligibility of Participants

A. Players must be eligible under the rules set forth by the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation and the Athletic Division.

B. All players must have attained the minimum age of eighteen (18) years old as of September 1st of the current season/session.

C. Players may participate on one (1) Men's or Women's Team and/or one (1) Mixed team per night.

III. Regulations Governing the Conduct of Games

A. USA Volleyball Rules and those adopted by the Athletic Division will govern all play.

B. A match may start with a minimum of four (4) legal players in Men's, Women's, and Mixed Leagues.

1. Men's and Women's Leagues: There must be at least two (2) players on both front and back lines at the time of service. Substitutions will take place at the middle back position. No front row member may be behind a back row member or vice versa. If more players arrive they may be substituted in at the middle back position at the first dead ball. Teams may play with four (4), five (5), or six (6) players.

2. Mixed Leagues: There must be a male and a female on both front and back lines at the time of service (when playing with (4) players.) Substitutions will take place at the middle back position. No front row member may be behind a back row member or vice versa. If more players arrive they may be substituted in at the middle back position at the first dead ball. Teams may only play with four (4) or six (6) players alternating (male and female) positions.
 3. No point will be awarded for vacant positions in Men's, Women's, or Mixed.
 4. Regular USA and City of Lubbock Rules apply when playing with six (6) or four (4) players.
- C. Game officials have full jurisdiction over all Participants and Spectators present at a City sponsored athletic contest. They shall have the power to take whatever steps necessary in order to maintain peace, order, and control of a situation as they see fit.
- D. **Any participant who physically attacks or verbally threatens a Game Official or City of Lubbock representative may be charged with assault and battery and be suspended indefinitely from all City of Lubbock athletic and recreational sponsored activities.**
- E. Participants in all sports should, upon request of a Game Official or City representative, be prepared to present proper identification (Texas Driver's License, Military or Photo ID) at game site. Failure to do so could result in a suspension and game forfeiture determined by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator.
- F. The Manager of a team may request an identification check of an opposing team's players through a Game official.
- G. Teams must substitute at the middle-back position at the time of rotation (except for injuries and if playing with less than six (6) players as referred to in Section III, Rule B). Substitutions are unlimited.
- H. Teams will be given a minimum of five (5) minutes warm-up time prior to the start of their scheduled match.
- I. Two (2) Time-Outs per team are allowed per game and shall be one (1) minute in duration. The game clock will stop during time-outs.

- J. A match is the best two (2) out of three (3) games. Once a score of twenty-five (25) points has been reached, that team must be leading by two or more points in order to end the game, though no game shall exceed a twenty-seven (27) point cap. If teams are tied at 26-26, the first team to score the twenty-seventh (27th) point shall be declared the winner. The scoring in a third and deciding game will be fifteen (15) points and the leader must have at least a two point advantage over the opponent. This game shall not exceed seventeen (17) points. If teams are tied at 16-16, the first team to score the seventeenth (17th) point shall be declared the winner.
1. Rally Point scoring is used in all games of a match. Net services are allowed per USA Volleyball Rules. With this system a point is awarded on each service, regardless of whether a team is serving or not.
 2. A fifteen (15) minute time limit will be used on each game.
- K. Regularly scheduled Game Time is Forfeit Time. Teams must have their players ready to play and their Line-Ups into the scorekeeper by Game Time. The second game and match will be forfeited fifteen (15) minutes after the first game is forfeited.
- L. The winner of a coin-flip will have choice of serve, court side, or receive.
- M. The ball may be played a maximum of three (3) times per side (excluding a block). In Mixed, if more than one contact is made on a side, one contact must be made by a female. A male is not required to contact the ball.
- N. It is not permissible to block or spike a served ball.
- O. It is a foul to step **completely** over the center line below the net. A player must have some part of their foot on or above the center line to be legal.
- P. A player may follow through over the net when hitting the ball providing they contact the ball on their side of the net first. Players may reach across the net to block, as long as his opponent contacts the ball first.
- Q. A ball landing on any part of a boundary line is in.
- R. Players on the back-line may not spike in front of the ten (10) foot line.
- S. In Mixed play, when only one male player is on the front-line, one male back-line player may also block at the net.

- T. Each team must provide a playable volleyball for league play. Types of volleyballs to be used shall be a white leather or synthetic leather ball that is USA Volleyball approved.

- U. The yellow/red card procedure will be used to handle unsportsmanlike conduct during league play. The yellow card refers to a warning to both the individual player and the team. The second offense will result in a red card being given, which will result in expulsion of the team member (s).

Penalty:

1. First offense may result in point or side out.
2. Second offense may result in yellow card (warning), point/side out.
3. Third offense may result in red card (ejection), point/side out.

IV. Jewelry

- A. Game officials will not allow the use of any equipment which in their opinion is unsafe to a participant or to the facility's equipment.

BASKETBALL

I. League Types

- A. All teams are required to maintain a roster in the City's Outdoor Recreation office. Teams may add and drop eligible players until the deadline date set by Outdoor Recreation. Teams may qualify for City, Regional and State competition. **Rosters shall not exceed 12 players.**

- B. Types of leagues offered are: Men's and Women's

II. Eligibility of Players

- A. All players must be eligible under the rules set forth by the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation and those adopted by the Athletic Division.

- B. All players must have attained the minimum age of eighteen (18) years old as of November 1st of the current calendar year.

- C. Any player registered in the same College after January 1st of the current season, and still a member of any squad (other than P.E. or Intramural), Junior College, College, University, or squad member of a military base team playing an off-base schedule is ineligible for participation and competition in this league.

- D. Players may participate on only one (1) men's or women's team per league.

III. Regulations Governing the Conduct of Games

- A. NCAA rules and those adopted by the Athletic Division will govern all play.

- B. Game officials have full jurisdiction over all Participants and Spectators present at a City sponsored athletic contest. They shall have the power to take whatever steps necessary in order to maintain peace, order, and control of a situation as they see fit.

- C. **Any participant who physically attacks or verbally threatens a Game Official or City of Lubbock representative may be charged with assault and battery and be suspended indefinitely from all City of Lubbock athletic and recreational sponsored activities.**

- D. Participant's in all sports should, upon request of a Game Official or City representative, be prepared to present proper identification (Texas Driver's License, Military or Photo ID) at game site. **Failure to do so could result in a suspension and game forfeiture determined by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator.**

- E. The Manager of a team may request an identification check of an opposing team's player(s) through a Game Official.
- F. Teams must begin play with no less than four (4) legal players. Line-Ups must be turned into the Official Scorekeeper five (5) minutes prior to regularly scheduled game time. All substitutes must be listed on the score sheet before the game starts or a Technical Foul will be called when the unlisted substitute enters the game. Failure to abide by this regulation may result in a forfeited game.
- G. Forfeits cannot be waived by an opposing team.
- H. Players will be ejected from the contest upon his/her second technical foul. The teams will not be allowed to substitute for this ejected player. Two (2) bench technical fouls will constitute a forfeited game.
- I. Any player being assessed a Flagrant foul for any reason shall receive the customary two (2) free-throw penalty, ejection from the contest and a possible game (s) suspension. A flagrant foul shall be deemed as a player purposely trying or intending to do physical harm to an opposing player. The team with the ejected player will not be able to substitute for this player for the remainder of the game.
- J. Play will consist of two (2) twenty (20) minute halves with running clocks. The clock will stop only for time outs and on the whistle during the last two minutes of each half; exception: when a team reaches a thirty (30) point lead, the clock will only stop for time outs, or upon the completion of the half, regardless if the lead drops below thirty (30) points.
- K. Timeouts – Two (2) full 60-second timeouts and two (2) 30-second timeouts will be allowed per game.
- L. Verbal outbursts of casual profanity of any nature, whether directed toward a person or object, is strictly prohibited.

IV. Equipment

- A. No jewelry will be allowed. Exception: Medical Alert jewelry will be allowed but it must be taped down. A flat wedding band will also be allowed. Participants refusing to remove jewelry will not be allowed to play.
- B. Teams must furnish their own warm-up basketballs. Teams must provide a playable regulation size basketball for league play. The referee shall be the sole judge of any ball offered for play at his/her discretion. Balls must be made of leather, no synthetic or plastic balls will be accepted.

BASEBALL

I. Rosters

- A. All teams are required to maintain a roster in the City's Outdoor Recreation office. Teams may add-drop eligible players until the deadline set by Outdoor Recreation. Rosters shall not exceed 20 players.

II. Eligibility of Players

- A. All players must be eligible under the rules set forth by the Outdoor Recreation Department.
- B. All players must have attained the minimum age of eighteen (18) years old at the time of play and be listed on the Roster registered with the Sports and Leisure Services Department.
- C. There is no age restriction for pitchers other than that of the minimum age requirement listed in B of this section.
- D. No more than three (3) players may be on a team who were listed on an active college roster for this year's season.
- E. No pitcher may be listed on an active high school, college, or professional roster (pitcher or otherwise) **for this year's season.**
- F. Players may participate on only one (1) team.

III. Regulations Governing the Conduct of Games

- A. Rules governing all play will be those adopted by the NFHS and the Outdoor Recreation Department
- B. Line-Ups must be turned in to the Official Scorekeeper five (5) minutes prior to the official Game Time. Each teams manager must present a written line-up containing the first and last names of his starting players according to the batting order. Line-ups turned in at this time must contain a minimum of eight (8) legal players to officially and legally start a game. Failure to abide by this regulation may result in a forfeited game. Scheduled game-time is forfeit time.
- C. Game officials have full jurisdiction over all participants and spectators present at a City sponsored athletic contest. They shall have the power to take whatever steps necessary in order to maintain peace, order and control of a situation as they see fit.

- D. **Any participant who physically attacks or verbally threatens a Game Official or City of Lubbock representative may be charged with assault and battery and be suspended indefinitely from all City of Lubbock athletic and recreational sponsored activities.**
- E. Participant's in all sports should, upon request of a Game Official or City representative, be prepared to present proper identification (Texas Driver's License, Military or Photo ID) at game site. **Failure to do so could result in a suspension and game forfeiture determined by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator.**
- F. The Manager of a team may request an identification check of an opposing team's player(s) through a Game Official.
- G. Substitutes must be reported to the official scorekeeper immediately upon entry into the game, both offensively and defensively.
- H. **All bats must conform to standards set forth by NFHS for the current year.**
- I. All batters/runners are required to wear the double ear flap helmet.
- J. Any player may withdraw from the game and re-enter once, provided such players occupy the same batting position whenever they re-enter the lineup.
- K. Any player, not currently officially in the game, may courtesy run for the pitcher or the catcher.
- L. All games will be 7 innings with a 2 hour time limit. The run rules are as follows: 15 run rule at the end of 3 inning or 10 run rule at the end of five innings.
- M. On an intentional walk, the batter may be waived to first base.
- N. The designated hitter may hit for any player.
- O. The NCAA Force Play Slide Rule and Batter's Box rule has been adopted for the LABL.
- P. In the event of a tie ball game after seven (7) innings, one more inning will be played. If a game is still tied after eight (8) complete innings, the game will remain a tie. Each team will be given 1/2 a win and 1/2 loss.

- Q. **Shorthanded Rule:** Any team starting with nine (9) or more players may drop down to the minimum eight (8) players for any reason. A team who has an ejected player may continue to play as long as the ejected player leaves the ballpark and they do not drop below the minimum of eight (8) players as a result of the ejection and must take an out in that spot.
- R. During the City Championship Tournament if a game is suspended due to inclement weather or any other reason the game will be resumed from the point of interruption at the next available date and time.

IV. Equipment

- A. Teams are required to furnish their own equipment.
- B. All equipment must comply with the current USSSA and NFHS rules and regulations.
- C. Jewelry is not permitted on the playing field if deemed unsafe by the umpire. Any player refusing to remove jewelry will not be allowed to participate. Exception: medical alert jewelry is allowed, but it must be taped down and a flat wedding band will be acceptable as well.
- D. All players must wear shirts with non-duplicating legible numbers on back. A player will not be allowed to participate without a legible number.
- E. The City's Athletic Division will furnish one dozen baseballs to each team at the time of schedule pick-up. Any additional baseballs must be purchased by the team and must be an approved USSSA or NFHS ball.

FLAG FOOTBALL

- I. All teams are required to maintain a roster in the City's Outdoor Recreation office. Teams may add-drop eligible players until the deadline set by Outdoor Recreation. **Rosters will be locked the LAST week of league play with NO adds/drops before playoffs. Rosters may include ONLY fifteen (15) players at one time.**

- II. **Eligibility of Players**
 - A. All players must be eligible under the rules set forth by the Athletic Division.

 - B. All players must have attained the minimum age of eighteen (18) years old at the time of play and be listed on the Roster registered with the Athletic Division.

 - C. A picture I.D. must be available for inspection at game site for all players.

- III. **Regulations Governing the Conduct of Games**
 - A. Rules governing all play will be those adopted by the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation (TAAF) and Athletic Division.

 - B. Game officials have full jurisdiction over all participants and spectators present at a City sponsored athletic contest. They shall have the power to take whatever steps necessary in order to maintain peace, order and control of a situation as they see fit.

 - C. **Any participant who physically attacks or verbally threatens a Game Official or City of Lubbock representative may be charged with assault and battery and be suspended indefinitely from all City of Lubbock athletic and recreational sponsored activities.**

 - D. Participant's in all sports should, upon request of a Game Official or City representative, be prepared to present proper identification (Texas Driver's License, Military or Photo ID) at game site. **Failure to do so could result in a suspension and game forfeiture determined by the Assistant Recreation Coordinator.**

 - E. The manager of a team may request an identification check of an opposing team's player(s) through a Game Official.

- F. Line-Up must be turned in to the Game Official five (5) minutes prior to the Official Game Time. Each teams manager must present a written line-up containing the first and last names of his/her players. Line-ups turned in at this time must contain a minimum of six (6) legal names to officially and legally start a game. Failure to abide by this regulation may result in a forfeited game.
- G. Substitutes must be listed on the line-up submitted to the Game Official.
- H. Scheduled Game Time is Forfeit Time.
- I. Each team must wear the Sonic Flag-A-Tag Belt.
- J. Play will consist of two (2) twenty halves with running clock. The 7 play rule is only used in the second half of play. If a team is ahead by 20 points at the 7 play warning of the second half of play the game is ended.
- K. Each team is entitled to two (2) time-outs per half.
- L. Players being ejected from any Flag Football contest will not be allowed to substitute for this ejected player.
- M. Profanity Penalty—There will be a 10 yard unsportsmanlike penalty assessed anytime during the game.

IV. Field

- A. 80 yards from goal line with two end zones of 10 yards each.
- B. Field shall be divided into 4 zones of 20 yards each.
- C. Field shall be a minimum of 40 yards wide and a maximum of 53 1/3 yards wide.

V. Equipment

- A. Jersey/ Shirts – All members of the same team must wear the same color jersey with non-duplicating numbers including at least an eight (8) inch number on back. The number on front is recommended but not mandatory. Jerseys must be tucked in. ***The midriff shirt will not be allowed in league play.** No article of clothing may cover any portion of a player's flag.

- B. Shirts/Pants – Pants or shorts may have no pockets or belt loops. Any shorts or pants that have striping, piping or a design that camouflages a player's flags or flag belt will not be allowed. Shorts/pants cannot be the same color as the flags.
- C. Shoes – Individuals may not play in their stockings or bare feet. Any flag soled or completely molded cleat shoes are acceptable. Removable cleats, baseball or track spikes or any shoes that have steel or metal tips are prohibited.
- D. Jewelry/Headwear – No jewelry of any kind may be worn by players. Any medical alert jewelry must be taped to the player. No headwear with an extended bill be worn. (Ex. Caps, visors, etc.)
- E. Ball - Each team must furnish a playable official size leather covered football, which is properly inflated. The referee shall be the sole judge of any ball offered for play at his/her discretion.
- F. Flags - Team must furnish and wear the Sonic Flag-A-Tag Belt. Teammates must wear the same color flags. Each player on the field will wear 2 flags at the waist, one on each side. Flags must be attached to a belt and the belt will be worn snug around the waist to eliminate being turned partially around the waist during an attempted de-flagging.

SOFTBALL FIELD RENTALS/SAND VOLLEYBALL COURTS...

A. Invitation Tournaments:

The public may rent City fields for the purpose of holding softball tournaments during the months of February through October. Contact the Athletic Division for further information regarding Regulations and Fees.

B. Team Practice:

The public may rent City facilities for the purpose of softball practice beginning in February through October. Contact the Athletic Division for further information regarding regulations and fees.

C. Sand Volleyball Courts:

Sand Volleyball courts may be rented from February through October. Cost is **\$17.50** per court per hour. Reservations shall be made in person and paid for at the time of reservation.

TEXAS AMATEUR ATHLETIC FEDERATION (T.A.A.F.)

Incorporated in 1925, the Texas Amateur Athletic Federation consists of Municipal Parks and Recreation Departments throughout the State of Texas involved in some thirty (30) separate sports. Lubbock is a charter member of this organization.

The non-profit organization is dedicated to develop and perpetuate interest in amateur sports and to further the spirit of sportsmanship in Texas.

UNITED STATES SPECIALTY SPORTS ASSOCIATION (USSSA)

This organization was created in 1968, originally as a slow pitch association. USSSA has since tripled in size and is now known as the world's largest multi-sport organization, which includes 12 sports. This organization is extremely instrumental in awarding the City of Lubbock a multitude of specialty tournaments which impact Lubbock's economy each year.

USSSA is committed to adults and youth alike and is extremely dedicated to the enhancement of sporting contests across the United States.

SUGGESTIONS

The Lubbock Athletic Division invites and encourages public input concerning program matters.
